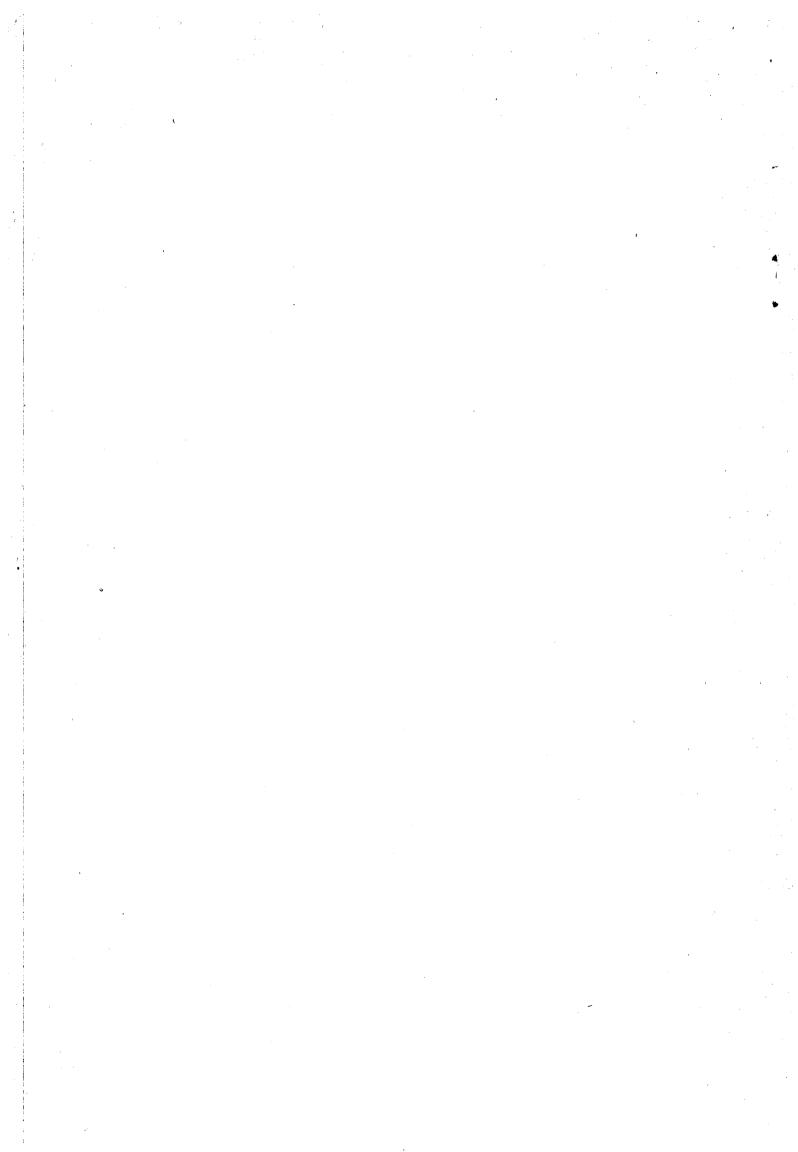

ADDENDUM

to the report by the Commission to the Council on the foreseeable developments in the planting and replanting of vineyards in the Community and on the ratio between production and utilization in the wine sector (Doc. COM(77) 22 final)



EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

The report on planting for the 1975/76 marketing year was presented by the Commission to the Council very late for reasons given in the introduction to the report itself. Examination of the report by the Wine Group of the Council could not be scheduled until April and since in the meantime the Member States have forwarded to the Commission the forecasts provided for in Article 17 of Regulation (EEC) No 816/70, it seemed advisable to incorporate the data provided in the report.

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The data on planting and grubbing reflect the notifications of producers' intentions and their reliability is relative. The preliminary comments on them in the first chapter of the report are entirely valid. Subject to these considerations, the following comments on the data in question may be useful.

I. FORESEEABLE DEVELOPMENT OF THE AREA UNDER VINES IN THE PRODUCER MEMBER STATES (TABLES 1-2-3-5 a)

(a) Germany

There are changes only as regards quality wines p.s.r. From the data provided the area under vines will increase by 0.2 % compared with the previous marketing year. Compared to 1975/76 there has been a slowdown in grubbing or planting and replanting. As in the previous year, most of the increase has occurred in the Freiburg region. It should be stressed with respect to new planting, that in view of the prohibition from 1 December 1976 they are unlikely to be carried out. In that case the total area will decline slightly.

(b) France

The French forecast shows a decline in total area of 16 043 ha, a reduction of 1.2 %. This change is the result of a marked decline (-19 633 ha) for table wine and an increase (+3 291 ha) for quality wine p.s.r. and wine for Cognac (+299 ha). The latter fact shows that unfortunately we are not moving in the right direction. It should be stressed that last year's forecast, a decline in area (-0.3 %), has not proved correct. The total area has increased by 0.2 %.

(c) Italy

The forecast for the 1975/76 marketing year (an increase of 0.8 % in total area) was slightly exceeded by the actual figures (a 1 % increase). For the 1976/77 marketing year, a decline of 0.5 % in total area is forecast, consisting of a decline (-7 525 ha) for table wine and a slight increase for quality wine p.s.r. At regional level, the decline in table wine has affected all regions but Apulia (Puglia) accounts for 50 % of this.

(d) Luxembourg

The area should hardly change. The expected change (+ 3 ha) would mean a 0.2 % increase in total area.

II. FORESEEABLE DEVELOPMENT OF TOTAL COMMUNITY AREA UNDER VINES

There are three factors tending in the same direction.

- 1. For the first time, the forecast shows a decline in total area under vines. The decline should amount to 0.9 % and compares with the 0.6 % increase in the 1975/76 marketing year. This reversal of the trend is solely due to the considerable decline that will occur in areas producing table wine (-27 159 ha), while a further increase in quality wine p.s.r. (+4863 ha) is expected.
- 2. With respect to area not yet in production, here too for the first time there is a decline which, although very slight, is not without significance.
- 3. Lastly, with respect to table grape production, a reduction (of 1 704 ha of which 1 529 ha in Italy) is expected and may be connected with the Council's decisions regarding the compulsory distillation of wine made from table grapes.

III. EFFECT ON FUTURE PRODUCTION OF CHANGES IN AREA UNDER VINES FORECAST FOR 1976/77 (TABLE 6a)

The forecast changes in area will have an effect on production which, as in the past, will not be in the same proportion. Against an expected decline of 0.9 % in area estimated production could fall by 0.2 %. It should be stressed that this percentage is the result of a 1 % decline in table wine (which is not negligible), a 2 % increase in quality wine p.s.r. and 0.5 % for other wines (all of which are wines for Cognac). This discrepancy between changes in area and in production once again confirms the advance in yield per hectare and reinforces the hypotheses set out in Chapter II of the Report.
