Derwent RENSHAW was born in Hull, Yorkshire, in 1930. After being educated at Ackworth School, he served for two years in the army before joining the British Civil Service.

Between 1951 and 1974, he was with the U.K. Ministry of Agriculture working in a number of divisions, including the National Food Survey and Cereals Division where he was concerned with the International Wheat Council and with the U.K.'s negotiations to join the European Community.

In 1974, he joined the Commission of the European Communities in Brussels where he served in the Cereals Division as principal administrator.

Married, with three children, he moved to Washington in November 1982 and was appointed Agricultural Counsellor in 1985.
