1974-1979 United Kingdom Permanent Representative to the United Nations

Since 1979 has been practising at the Bar.

Member of the Fabian Society, the Society of Labour Lawyers, the Institute of Strategic Studies and the Royal Institute of International Affairs.

Was a Governor of the Atlantic Institute.
