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Claudio Segré was born in 1932 in Rome. He received the doctorate in law from the University of Rome and the Ph.D. from Yale University, and is a member of the faculty of political economy at the University of Rome.

He has worked as an economist at Suimez in Rome, the Institute for the Development of Southern Italy, preparing special studies for the Italian government.

From 1959 until January 1965, Dr. Segré was a division chief in the Directorate General for Economic and Financial Affairs of the Commission of the European Economic Community. In this capacity, he was concerned with questions of capital movements, export credits and other financial relations with third countries. He has often represented the EEC Commission at the Development Assistance Committee of the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development in Paris.

In January 1965, Dr. Segré became Director of the Studies Division in the EEC Directorate General for Economic and Financial Affairs.

He is author of a book, Medium Term Export Finance, published in 1958 by the Banca Nazionale Del Lavoro. He has also written numerous articles on economic theory and international financial policy.

Dr. Segré speaks Italian, French, German, English and Russian.

Né à Rome en 1932, M. Claudio SEGRE est docteur en droit et agrégé de politique économique de l'Université de Yale. En 1957 et 1958, il a occupé un poste d'économiste à la "Svimez", organisme de recherche et de consultation économique dirigé par le professeur SARACENO. En 1959, il fut membre de division à la Direction des problèmes monétaires de la C.E.E. et en 1961, chef de la division "Mouvement de capitaux", avant de devenir en 1965, directeur des études et de la coordination à la Direction générale des Affaires économiques et financières de la C.E.E.

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
