Nevertheless, the reader will find that this handbook is a mine of information on all spheres of activity; it will help him to make out the various aspects of one stage in the gradual economic integration of six European countries.

LAYOUT

This handbook is a compilation of statistics designed to show how the economies of the six countries of the European Economic Community have developed in the ten-year period 1958-67. It begins with a table summarizing the main statistics for the EEC as a whole. The tables which follow are grouped under various heads, each dealing with a different aspect of the economy and introduced by a short commentary pointing out its salient features. Finally, a section entitled "The Community and the outside world" affords a comparison with selected non-EEC countries.

The handbook has been deliberately kept compact and concise: hence its format and the choice of statistics. The compilers were concerned more to give examples illustrating the varied aspects of social activity than to be exhaustive and methodical. This explains the virtual disappearance of the notes, reservations and definitions which are symptoms of the statistician's occupational disease and at the same time tokens of his integrity. More demanding readers will find further information in other SOEC publications—in the specialized yearbooks in particular.

A few general explanations may, however, be of assistance to those consulting this handbook. Figures for the Federal Republic of Germany include the Saar and West Berlin unless otherwise indicated. Rates of increase (overall or annual average) are given in many tables because this is a simple straightforward way of assessing progress. The overall increase is calculated as a percentage increase on 1958 and normally refers to the nine-year interval separating 1958 from 1967; this rate is given only if figures for the last year are available. It may sometimes refer to a shorter period if the last year's figures are missing for all the countries in a table. The annual average increase is calculated as a percentage too, but then by the same formula as is used to calculate compound interest. This rate is shown even if the latest figures are missing; it is then based on available years only.

An attempt has been made to facilitate comparison of the figures; all values, for example, have been expressed in a common monetary unit. But the user must guard against reading too much into these figures: the Community's statistics, like its economies, are only in the process of being integrated. For the most part the figures come from national sources. Some of these are "harmonized" at source as a result of Community agreements; others have been adjusted by the SOEC to improve their comparability. International sources (OECD, UN) were used for "The Community and the outside world".

MAN AS A FACTOR IN THE ECONOMY

Man's part in the economy is twofold: he is an essential factor of production, and at the same time he is the real object of economic activity since the only ultimate utility of this is the satisfaction of human wants.

In the tables on population trends and patterns, employment, unemployment and so on, which follow, man is viewed primarily as a producer of goods or services. In the tables dealing with income and standard of living, at the end of the handbook, man is viewed as a consumer.

The total population in the Community countries went up by an average 1% per annum during the period under review. This is a moderate rate of increase in comparison with that of the world population as a whole (1.6%), and in the view of most specialists it is pretty well the optimum, in the medium term at all events. For it must be borne in mind that a growing population, though it does present certain problems particularly with regard to public capital expenditure on the necessary facilities and amenities, nevertheless makes it easier to carry through the inescapable adjustments which technological progress demands. The relative contraction in the agricultural labour force we are now witnessing, for example, would entail far more hardship if farm produce were not being sold on a steadily expanding market.

Although the overall trend of population is quite satisfactory, its age distribution is much less so: the proportion aged 65 and over has risen sharply in the last few years, increasing from 10.2 to 11.5% between 1958 and 1966. All the forward studies suggest that this trend will continue for some time to come; by 1980 persons of 65 and over will represent approximately 13.5% of the total population.

The population of working age—by convention, those between 15 and 64—increased very little (0.8%) between 1958 and 1967. This increase was almost offset by the higher school-leaving age and the lower retirement age. The working population, then, has remained constant, and its share in a growing total population has fallen even more than that of the population of working age. In 1958, 100 gainfully employed persons had to support 127 who were not; by 1967 the same 100 had to support 150. This does not apply to either the Netherlands or Belgium, however, where the total activity rate did not decline during the period under review. The breakdown of employment by main economic sector shows a significant trend. Of 100 persons in employment in 1958, 23 were working in agriculture, 41 in manufacturing industry and 36 in the service industries. By 1967, the figures had become 16, 44 and 40 respectively. These are figures for the Community, and they gloss

over changes that vary from one country to another, but the trend in all of them conforms to a pattern typical of the stage of development now reached in Europe, i.e. a marked decline in agricultural employment, a particularly rapid expansion in the services sector and an increase in industrial employment which may perhaps be levelling off.

Unemployment, which stood at 3.4% in 1958, had dropped to 1.4% five years later but rose again to 2.3% in 1967. This general picture, however, veils highly divergent patterns in the various countries, industries and age groups. Unemployment fell sharply in all Community countries until 1966, except in France, where it began to increase again as early as 1964. Italy was the only country in which unemployment continued to shrink in 1967; unemployment figures in the other five countries climbed relentlessly.







NATIONAL ACCOUNTS

Since 1958 the gross national product of the six EEC countries, calculated at current prices and exchange rates, has more than doubled, reaching \$340 000 million in 1967.

If the incidence of rising prices is disregarded, the Community is seen to have expanded the volume of its gross product by 56% between 1958 and 1967. Per head of population, this amounts to a 42% increase.

Together with this sustained economic growth, there was a reduction in the differences between the levels of per capita GNP in the six member countries. Italy, for instance, whose per capita product is the lowest in the Community, has made the most rapid progress since 1958, while Luxembourg, which had the highest per capita GNP initially, has made distinctly slower progress than the other member countries.

The breakdown of domestic product by sector shows that during the period in question the share of agriculture decreased in all member countries. Taking the Community as a unit, it fell from 10% in 1958 to less than 7% in 1966. The share of manufacturing industry as a whole (including construction) remained virtually constant (47% in the Community generally), but the relative weight of the various groups of industries altered considerably. The contribution made by the services sector increased in every country: for the Community as a whole it rose from 43% in 1958 to more than 46% in 1966.

If we consider the various expenditures generating GNP, the salient point to note is the rapid increase in the share of gross fixed asset formation, which went up from 20.4% in 1958 to 23.5% in 1964. It has since fallen somewhat (21.9% in 1967) owing to the slowdown in economic growth. None the less, the volume of investment increased faster than that of consumption over the whole period.

Another feature of the trend in most member countries is the increased proportion of public consumption expenditure in the utilization of resources (up from 13% in 1958 to 15% in 1967 for the Community as a whole). This appears to be due mainly to wage and salary increases in the public sector, an item which has a major impact on this type of expenditure.

Despite the increased pressure on total resources by investment and public consumption expenditure, private consumption—the indispensable yardstick of the standard of living—expanded considerably. In the Community as a whole it went up 55% in volume, or 42% per head, between 1958 and 1967. The highest rate of increase (about 50%) was recorded in Italy and the Netherlands, the two countries which had the lowest consumption per head in 1958. Luxembourg and Belgium, which had the highest levels of consumption to begin with, had the lowest rate of increase (about 30%).

Together with the expansion of consumption by households, there were changes in the pattern of spending. Between 1958 and 1966 the proportion of total expenditure going on food, beverages and tobacco in the Community as a whole fell from 42.6 to 37.2%, and the proportion spent on clothing and footwear from 11.4 to 10.7%. Against this, the proportion of private consumption absorbed by rents, medical expenses and personal care, transport and communication and other goods and services rose considerably (31.9% in 1966, compared with 26.2% in 1958).





AGRICULTURE

Agricultural output in the Community as a whole increased by more than a quarter over the last nine years—an average annual growth rate of 3.1%, ranging from 1.6% in Belgium to 3.9% in France.

There was a spectacular increase in the output of certain livestock products—particularly poultrymeat (130%) and cheese (46%). Given that 1967 was an exceptional year, the increase in output of crop products was less remarkable.

Alongside this expansion of agricultural production we find a more intensive utilization of mechanical inputs bought from other sectors, both at home and abroad. Agriculture's purchases from other sectors increased at an annual rate of 8.6% and in 1966 represented almost one third of agricultural output.

The total number of farms declined, the annual rate of decrease varying from 2% in Germany to 3.6% in Belgium. This was due to the combined effects of a sharp drop in the number of farms of 5 hectares and under and a slight increase in large farms of 20 hectares and over. Investment in production inputs and concentration of holdings were reflected in improved yields per hectare and a drop in the numbers employed.

Generally speaking, farm-gate prices rose less than consumer prices. The divergence is particularly marked in Germany, where prices to the producer increased by only 12% between 1958 and 1967.

The degree of self-sufficiency has changed very little for the vast majority of products, though self-sufficiency in eggs has increased sharply. For other products there is if anything a slight tendency for the degree of self-sufficiency to decline. The Community is sometimes accused of moving towards complete autarky in food: this is not borne out by the figures, however.

The Community is still a major importer of cereals (it imported approximately 12 million tons in ten years), oilseeds, oleaginous fruit and oils; it has slight surpluses of vegetables, pigmeat and certain milk products.





ENERGY

The economic expansion of the Community over the last ten years has meant that its energy requirements have increased rapidly: they jumped from 420 million tons of coal equivalent in 1958 to almost 670 million tons in 1967, giving an annual average rate of increase of 5.3%, which matches the growth rate of GNP.

This overall trend, however, conceals:

- (a) differing trends in the various sectors of consumption;
- (b) substantial differences in the contribution made by each form of energy to satisfying demand.

The highest rate of increase was in consumption by households and the tertiary sector (6.1% a year), where it was due to higher standards of comfort both in the matter of heating and as regards labour-saving devices. The boom in road and air transport, combined with electrification and dieselization on the railways, has led to an average annual increase of 5.5% in consumption by transport facilities. Industry remains the biggest consumer of energy, still absorbing a little over half of final consumption; but its requirements have increased at an appreciably slower rate (4.1% per annum) because of the sharp decline in specific consumption per unit of industrial output (the average annual growth rate of industrial production is 6%).


Even more interesting than the variety of developments in the different sectors of consumption are the diverging consumption patterns for the different forms of energy over the last ten years.

For economic and technical reasons, among which price, convenience and adaptability have played a leading role, total demand, deriving mainly from specific requirements for fuel, has turned more and more to petroleum products and has led to an unprecedented expansion of the petroleum industry. Between 1958 and 1967 crude oil requirements increased by an annual average of 15%. Gross inland consumption of coal declined by almost 2% a year over the same period.

While solid fuel (coal and lignite) covered 65% of the Community's primary energy requirements in 1958, then, its share had dropped as low as 35% by 1967. Conversely, the demand for crude oil jumped from 25 to 54% and now represents more than half the EEC's total energy consumption.

This change in the pattern of demand has caused a basic shift in the structure of energy supplies. Ten years ago almost three quarters of gross consumption of primary energy could be met from Community production (mainly coal); in 1965 self-sufficiency dropped to less than half; and by 1967, 56% of the Community's energy requirements were being met from outside (mainly petroleum).

It looks, however, as if rapid advances in the use of natural gas and nuclear energy, which have only begun to be developed commercially during the last ten years, will tend to reduce the Community's energy deficit in the years ahead.






INDUSTRY

Most statistics on industrial activity bear witness to the favourable effects that the establishment of the Common Market has had on this sector of the economy, whose share in the Community's gross domestic product is in the region of 50%.

Over the period 1958-67 the general index of industrial production in the Community went up by 67%—an annual average rate of 5.9%. In all member countries but Luxembourg, the expansion of production was continuous and steady from 1958 until 1966. In France, Italy and the Netherlands, expansion was maintained in 1967, but it levelled off in Belgium and gave way to a slight slowdown in Germany.

Total growth at the end of the ten-year period varies quite considerably from one country to another: Italy heads the table, having more than doubled its production; the Netherlands comes next with an 88% increase, followed by Germany with 60%, France with 55% and Belgium with 53%; Luxembourg brings up the rear with 20%.

But apart from the distinctions between Community countries, it is particularly when the reader goes on from the general indices to the detailed statistics for individual industries and products that he can detect, within the main stream of expansion, the currents which speed up or hold back the general trend. He will note, for instance, the exceptional dynamism of the growth industries stimulated either by technical progress, as in the case of chemicals and electrical appliances, or by rising standards of living, as in the case of motor vehicles. As against this he will note the relative decline of those industries which are now contending with difficulties of structural adaptation—the coal and iron mines and the shipyards. Optimism, however, is the keynote of this statistical picture of industrial activity. Some outstanding examples are quoted below.

Community production of man-made fibres jumped from 73 000 tons in 1958 to approximately 600 000 tons in 1967; production of plastics increased from 1.1 million tons to almost 5 million tons. Production of milk powder and particle board quadrupled, production of ladies' stockings increased threefold, and production of electrical washing machines almost tripled. Increases of 100% or more were recorded for motor vehicles and tyres.

Of all productive activities, industry continues to be the main motive force of the EEC, as is borne out by its growing share in gross domestic product, which rose from 47% in 1958 to 51% in 1966 (at constant prices).



INTERNAL TRADE

Because of the difficulty of compiling comparable statistics on trends for trade and services as a whole, and in view of the limited scope of this handbook, the remarks which follow are confined to two major consumption areas—large retail firms and tourism.

Over the past ten years the turnover of department stores in EEC countries increased more rapidly than private consumption. By employing modern marketing techniques these stores have turned economic growth to their advantage, improving their relative position in retail trade. The rates of increase recorded are high: they range from 150% in Germany and the Netherlands to 300% in Italy. The general trend was not followed in Belgium, however, where expansion was curbed until 1961 by a law prohibiting the opening of branches by department stores and the establishment of new department stores and where a serious fire in 1967 also had repercussions on trade. Foodstuffs head the table of increased sales; in Italy food sales are now eight times higher than in 1958.

An even greater increase than this, however, was attained by Italian chain stores (again for foodstuffs)—much of it certainly due to the many supermarkets opened during this period. The relative advance of chain stores on department stores was noted in Belgium too, but the phenomenon has not yet been confirmed in the other member countries, though this type of firm is expanding vigorously everywhere.

Consumer co-operatives did not achieve the same rate of expansion, though their sales increased by anything from 50% in Germany and Belgium to 117% in Italy.

The tourism boom continues year after year in most EEC countries. This is supported by statistics for the number of tourist nights in hotels, which went up by about 6% a year in France, Italy and the Netherlands. In Belgium, however, the number of tourists staying in hotels has been falling off for some years, possibly because more and more families now prefer to rent holiday apartments.

In most countries, the inflow of tourists from abroad seems to have grown more rapidly than domestic tourism. But the proportion of foreign tourist nights to all tourist nights varies from 28% in France to 94% in Luxembourg.

Tourist nights in youth hostels are on the decline in most countries, though in France they continue to increase steadily.

FOREIGN TRADE IN VISIBLES

Trade between the member countries of the European Communities, which amounted to \$6 800 million in 1958, grew steadily over the years to reach \$24 200 million in 1967. The present volume of Community trade is therefore 3.5 times its 1958 level, which works out at an average annual growth rate of 15%.

Since 1958 France and Italy—in that order—have seen their share of intra-Community trade increase, while the Benelux countries' share fell. This is due in part at least to the reduction in intra-Community customs duties, which was bigger in France and Italy, where tariffs generally were at a high level at the outset, than in Benelux, where they were very low to begin with.

Thanks to increased merchandise trade, the interpenetration of the economies has become much more marked during the last nine years. Although intra-Community trade accounted for no more than 30% of all Community imports and exports in 1958, this proportion had risen to 44% by 1967. The pattern has been rather similar in all the Member States, for each of which the rest of the Community is by far the most important market. In 1967, other Community countries accounted for 56% of BLEU imports and 63% of its exports; BLEU already headed this particular table in 1958. The impact of the liberalization of intra-Community trade is most evident, however, in France: the Community's share in total French trade has practically doubled since 1958, so that in 1967 43% of all its imports came from the Community and 41% of all its exports went to other member countries.


In 1967, EEC imports from non-member countries totalled \$30 800 million and its exports to non-EEC countries \$31 600 million. Although the share of non-EEC countries in the overall trade of the member countries fell—a normal effect of the Common Market—trade with the rest of the world did benefit from internal expansion too, as is shown by the fact that imports are 90% and exports 100% up on 1958.

The industrialized countries of the West account for most of this trade—55% of imports and 65% of exports in 1967—and their share is still growing. These countries include the Community's main customers and suppliers, namely the United States and the United Kingdom; imports from these two countries increased by 100% and exports to them by 138% between 1958 and 1967.

In trade with the developing countries, among which Latin America occupies a leading position, imports have increased much more sharply (69%) than exports (34%). The same is true of trade with the Associated African States: imports have increased by 43% and exports by 30%.

It is interesting to note that trade with the countries of Eastern Europe has increased vigorously—imports up by 197% and exports by 236%—though the overall level of trade with these countries is still relatively low.

If the figures for imports are corrected by some 10% to allow for transport costs—included in import figures but not in export figures—it will be seen that over the entire period 1958-67 the EEC had a slight but permanent surplus on visible trade. Although imports and exports very nearly balance out in the Community's external trade as a whole, there are big differences between the two in the case of some of the Community's trading partners; the most important of these are a large deficit on trade with the United States and the developing countries and, conversely, a large surplus on trade with EFTA countries other than the United Kingdom.

MONEY AND CREDIT

Economic activity in the Community expanded steadily between 1958 and 1967, which made for the increase of 111% in GNP indicated in the National Accounts tables. To finance this expansion a growing volume of funds had to be made available to the economy through the creation of monetary liquidity or long-term indebtedness.

The total money supply increased from \$44 200 million in 1958 to \$105 300 million in 1967—an average annual increase of 10.13%. The highest average rate of expansion (14%) was recorded in Italy. The average increase in monetary liquidity remained quite moderate in the Netherlands, on the other hand (8.16%), and was even more modest in Belgium (5.9%). Bank money grew more rapidly than paper money (177% and 89% respectively between 1958 and 1967).

Borrowing on the capital market increased by 144% between 1958 and 1967 (or by 10.6% a year on average), though share issues did not increase to the same extent as bond issues (49% and 171% respectively). Stock exchange trends have been unfavourable to shares since 1962, and this has caused a number of potential subscribers and borrowers to shy away from this way of financing the economy. This trend can be seen quite clearly in the share price index, which moved from 100 in 1958 up to 227 in 1961 but dropped back to 159 in 1967, mainly because of narrower profit margins and the fear of increased competition as a result of tariff dismantlement.

Not only private-sector firms have been borrowing long-term capital: the public sector too has always been one of the main issuers of bonds. Despite all attempts at budgetary reform, budgets almost invariably close with a deficit, and this is the main reason behind the growth of public indebtedness. Most of the public sector's borrowing is on the domestic market, and recourse to foreign loans has steadily declined in all Community countries but Belgium.

Lastly, it must be stressed that the expansion of monetary liquidity has not been due to internal causes alone. Another contributory factor was the favourable trend of the Community's balance of payments with the rest of the world, which meant a considerable increase in gold and foreign exchange reserves—from \$11 906 million to more than \$21 000 million over the ten-year period.

BALANCE OF PAYMENTS

During the four years covered here (1963 to 1966) the consolidated balance of payments of the EEC countries regularly showed a surplus; this reached a record figure of \$2 140 million in 1965 but fell back to \$1 232 million in 1966. The decline was due to a substantial reduction in the French and Italian payments surpluses, which the great improvement in the overall German payments balance—from a \$514 million deficit in 1965 to a \$388 million surplus in 1966—was not enough to offset.

An analysis of the main items in the consolidated balance shows a steady increase in the surplus on current account due to the continued vigorous expansion of the surplus on visible trade and—since 1965—a modest recovery in the surplus on invisibles. With this improvement in the current account, the EEC countries' consolidated balance was in a position to take not only the constant increase in its structural deficit on transfer payments (up 14.2% between 1963 and 1966) but also the appearance in 1965 of a deficit on capital of non-monetary sectors (which meant that from that year the EEC as a whole was a net exporter of capital to the rest of the world).

As for the contribution made by the different member countries to the trend of the various items in the consolidated balance, it must be pointed out that:

- (a) the improvement in the surplus on visibles was mainly due—until 1965—to the constantly favourable trend of this item in the payments of Italy and BLEU and—in 1966—to its remarkable recovery in the German payments balance;
- (b) the surplus on invisibles rose steadily from 1965 onwards thanks to the steady improvement in this item in the Italian and Dutch payments, offsetting the opposite trend in the German and French payments;
- (c) both the existence of a structural deficit on transfer payments in the consolidated balance and the increase in that deficit are attributable almost entirely to increasingly heavy deficits on these transfers in the German payments, which have more than counterbalanced the surpluses recorded in Italy;
- (d) the sharp rise in the deficit on capital of non-monetary sectors beginning in 1965 is mainly due to growing deficits under this head in the Italian payments balance, a lesser cause being a reduction in the German surplus.

PRICES

Prices are among the most immediate factors of daily life for all of us, producers and consumers alike. We know, however, that they result from a delicate system of balances and that they are difficult to measure, to understand and also to control. Consumer prices in the EEC went up between 1958 and 1967, as they did—but not more than they did—in the years before 1958 and as they have done in most other countries. The average annual increase ranges from 2.3% in Germany and Belgium to 3.6% in Italy and the Netherlands and 3.8% in France. Price increases were very moderate at the beginning of the period (except in France, where the effects of devaluation sent prices up more steeply); they became more marked between 1961 and 1966 and have eased off again since then.

The movement of prices follows the normal variations in the economic trend pretty closely, the moderate increases corresponding to recovery following a slowdown and the sharper increases to periods of heightened economic activity.

Against the backdrop of the general economic situation we find other factors which are perhaps more fundamental but whose effect on the overall price trend is harder to assess with our statistics as they now are. One such factor is the gradual opening of frontiers, which is tending to narrow the gap between prices in the different countries and to hold them in check by making competition keener. Despite the deficiencies in statistical sources, this trend can already be discerned in a number of industrial products, including motor vehicles and certain domestic appliances.

Developments in productivity is another factor which has a strong influence on the pattern of prices. Comparing statistics for gross domestic product by sector calculated at current prices with those calculated at constant prices, we see that prices for agricultural commodities have risen more sharply than those for manufactures and that the increase in prices for services has been even more vigorous. This, of course, is in inverse proportion to productivity gains in the sectors concerned. This is also why wholesale price indices, which cover a high proportion of manufactures but reflect only a limited proportion of distribution costs, have gone up much less (and even dropped back from time to time) than consumer price indices, which include a high proportion of agricultural products and services and all distribution costs.

INCOME AND WAGES

In 1966, according to national accounts statistics, 95% of national income in the EEC as a whole went to households. Total income of households can in turn be broken down into compensation of employees and income of other population groups (the self-employed, employers and those not working for pay or gain). The share of national income accounted for by compensation of employees (which includes employers' social security contributions) went up from 58% in 1958 to 65% in 1966. Much of the increase is due to the growing number of wage- and salary-earners in the total working population and, it would appear, to a slight narrowing of the gap between their average income and that of the rest of the population. The average level of income per employee nearly doubled between 1958 and 1966 to reach almost \$2 800 a year.

The improvement in real terms, once increases in the cost of living have been discounted, varies between 4 and 6% a year depending on the country. Discrepancies between levels of income in the different member countries are now smaller, Italy in particular having gone some way towards catching up with its partners.

On the whole, the proportion of income received by employees in the form of direct wages and salaries declined between 1958 and 1966, with a corresponding increase in the proportion made up by employers' social-security contributions, though this did not apply in Germany. In other words, total income increased more rapidly than direct wages and salaries.

Another important factor affecting annual wage is the number of hours worked. Here, there are hardly any statistics except for industrial workers, and for these the number of hours worked has fallen slightly in EEC countries since 1958, except in France, where the total has remained almost the same. Paid holidays are, generally speaking, longer now, particularly in France.







Harmonized statistics, which will make it possible to observe and compare the trend of hourly earnings in the EEC countries in future, are only available from 1964 onwards. They do confirm, however, that the differences in wage levels between member countries—as well as in total compensation of employees—have been diminishing since that date. They also show that the gap between the earnings of male and female workers is growing smaller. This has been most marked in Luxembourg and Belgium, two countries where the gap was particularly wide initially.

SOCIAL SECURITY BENEFITS¹⁾

There has been a marked rise in social security outgoings since 1958, outstripping in every country the growth of GNP. The rate of increase has, however, varied a good deal from one country to another: in Italy and the Netherlands it has worked out appreciably higher than elsewhere, doubtless because the levels of benefit were so different initially and have meantime evened up to a certain extent. This is borne out by the trend in relation to GNP, since whereas in 1958 the proportion of GNP represented by social security outgoings in the several countries ranged from 9.9 to 14.5%, by 1965 the lowest figure was 14.2% and the highest 15.1%. Further confirmation is afforded by the figures for social security outgoings per head of population: in 1958 the highest national figure was treble the lowest and in 1965 only double.

As regards the actual benefits, one notable development found everywhere has been the increase in medical payments, which account for roughly the same proportion of total social security expenditure in all Community countries. The position as regards other contingencies is more varied, the focus being sometimes on old-age insurance (Germany), sometimes on family allowances (France) and sometimes on disablement and industrial injuries (Luxembourg).

The financing arrangements reflect the differences in organization and approach from country to country: direct employers' contributions bulk largest in France and Italy, insured persons' own contributions in Germany and the Netherlands and aid from public funds in Belgium and Luxembourg. This pattern, already in evidence in the 1958 figures, is still there in 1965, the financing arrangements having undergone little change in the interval. A certain shift in emphasis is, however, discernible, with the share of employers' contributions decreasing in varying degrees in a number of countries (Germany, Italy, the Netherlands, Luxembourg) and that of insured persons' contributions or assistance from the public purse increasing correspondingly.

Given the differences observable in 1958, then, the statistics of social security receipts and expenditure show features common to certain aspects of the current trend and also indicate that the gaps between the different levels of benefit are tending to narrow.

THE COMMUNITY AND THE OUTSIDE WORLD

In 1966 the Community's 180 million people represented 5.5% of the world population and occupied less than 1% of the total land area. The United States and the USSR, with slightly higher populations—6 and 7% respectively of the world total—occupy 7 and 16.5% of the total land area. Population density is therefore very high in the Community; in the Benelux countries it is even higher than in Japan. Compared with the world average and with the situation in the United States and the USSR, the Community's population has a relatively high proportion of older people and, conversely, a rather low proportion of young people. The distribution of employment among the main sectors is characteristic of a developed economy: a relatively small proportion of the population is employed in agriculture, and a large proportion in industry and services. However, the decline in agricultural employment and the expansion of employment in the services sector is still much less spectacular than in the United States, whose economy is at a more advanced stage.

Although any comparison of national figures for per capita GNP must be treated with reserve, these point uncontestedly to the existence of a similar ranking in stages of development. They also show, however, that the Community has made up some leeway, having almost doubled its per capita GNP between 1958 and 1967 while the increase in the United States was only a little over a half. The Community's growth rate is in fact one of the highest achieved by industrial countries during this period, though well below that of Japan, whose per capita GNP more than trebled. (Japan, of course, was lagging behind at the outset.)

The Community is also holding its own in world trade: in 1967 the EEC accounted for more than 18% of world trade (excluding trade between EEC countries, which represented approximately 14% of the world total). In terms of overall value, then, the EEC's external trade is pretty much on a par with that of the United States; expressed as a proportion of national product, it comes out better (approximately 9% for the EEC, about 4% for the USA). EEC trade with the rest of the world almost doubled between 1958 and 1967. Much the same growth rate was recorded by the United States, Canada and the USSR, but this was more than bettered by Japan. This expansion of trade cannot be regarded as exceptional, then, but it should not be forgotten that over the same period intra-Community trade grew three and a half times.

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
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
