	The rate of execution of the STOA Workplan and budget has shown further progress in 1998, outstripping 1996 and 1997 benchmarks. Eighteen out of the twenty projects in the 1998 Workplan will have been launched before the summer break. Mr Ismael OLIVARES MARTINEZ, Director, Directorate B, of the Directorate-General for Research, presented latest budget figures to the Panel at its meeting on 16 July.		
	The 1998 Conference of the European Parliamentary Technology Assessment network (EPTA), chaired by STOA, will be held at the European Parliament in Brussels on the afternoon of Thursday, 1 October and the morning of Friday, 2 October 1998. It will be followed on the Friday afternoon by the Annual Meeting of the EPTA Council. The working title for the Conference is "TECHNOLOGICAL CHOICES IN THEIR ETHICAL CONTEXT: Examples of parliamentary technology assessment projects as case-studies in the interaction between the technical and the ethical - problems and solutions". The EPTA network was established under the patronage of the President of the European Parliament.
