



# NEWS

The deadline for the receipt of proposals from Committees of the European Parliament for projects under the 1996 STOA Workplan is 15 January 1996. At the back of this Newsletter, the form for making a proposal is attached. It is also available, in all languages, from the STOA secretariat, and in English, from the Committee secretariats. It is primarily intended for Committees or Parliament as a whole. Members who wish to make a proposal(s) for a potential STOA project, should present it first to their Committee. The STOA Panel will examine and discuss the proposals at its January and February meetings. It is intended that the 1996 Workplan be adopted at the meeting on 15 February 1996.
Mrs Renate HEINISCH, Vice-Chairman of the STOA Panel, represented STOA at the inauguration of the Institute for Prospective Technological Studies in Seville, on Monday 4 December 1995. The IPTS was inaugurated by Mme Edith CRESSON, Commissioner for Research. Mr MARSET CAMPOS, MEP, also attended.
Mr ALLGEIER, Director of the Institute for Prospective Technological Studies of Seville, will give a presentation on the role of this institute of the Joint Research Centre of the European Union at the December STOA Panel meeting.
The new EPTA Newsletter is available and covers Technology Assessment in Eastern European countries. A report of the EPTA Conference on 'Information technologies' as well as the proceedings of the EPTA Council Meeting held in The Hague on 28-29 September are included. The European Information Technology Conference 1995 (EITC'95) organised by DGIII-Industry of the European Commission was held on 27-29 November in Brussels. The conference was concerned with the debate on social, societal and cultural issues of the information society. Among those attending this conference on behalf of the STOA Unit were members of the STOA Information Society Project Team: Ineke MALSCH, Caroline RAY, and Christine WENNRICH, STOA Scholars.
An international conference was organised by the Wissenschaftszentrum Berlin (WZB) in cooperation with the European Commission, on 'Public Understanding of Science and Technology - A critical examination of current research results and methods'. The conference was held on 30 November - 2 December 1995 in Berlin. The aims of the conference were to assess the conceptual, empirical and methodological aspects of current research on the public understanding of science and technology and to initiate a discussion on this matter between politicians and academics. Mrs Renate HEINISCH, Vice-Chairman of the STOA Panel, and Mr Rolf LINKOHR, Member of the STOA Panel, attended this conference. The Team was represented by Christine WENNRICH, EPTA Coordinator.


We are pleased to announce that the STOA office in Brussels has now acquired an E-mail address as follows:

#### **PART A - GENERAL INFORMATION**

- 1. The STOA Panel invites proposals for projects to be entered in the STOA Workplan 1996. Proposals may be made by Committees, Sub-Committees or by Parliament as a whole.
- 2. STOA can only consider proposals for projects in the following areas: the assessment of policy options in science or technology, or the assessment of options relevant to the impact of science or technology on society, the economy or the environment. Please note that STOA is the research service in the Directorate-General for Research (DGIV) specifically responsible for scientific and technological assessment projects. Other research projects, not specifically involving scientific or technological assessment, may be requested from DGIV under its General Studies Programme by writing to Mr Robert RAMSAY, Director-General for Research.
- 3. Proposers are requested to submit them in writing, using this form, to the Chairman of the STOA Panel as soon as possible and no later than 18.00 on Monday, 15 January 1996. The address is:

- 4. If a Committee foresees that it will not have completed its own formal approval procedure before 15 January 1996, the Panel may consider provisional proposals, provided that the provisional proposal is submitted on the prescribed form by 15 January 1996 and that the formal confirmation is received in writing by 18.00 on 14 February 1996.
- 5. Proposers are requested to use the attached form. The purpose of the form is to give proposers the opportunity to provide information about their project that will help the Panel in drawing up the Workplan.
- 6. After completing the Proposal Form, the proposer may wish to provide additional information. This may be attached as an Annex.
